New Issues in Security Course (NISC) 20th Edition

Mapping Today's Security Environment to Meet Tomorrow's Challenges

6 May - 28 June 2019

Course location:

Geneva, Switzerland

The 20th NISC responds to the need for a better understanding of new and re-emerging security challenges arising from a rapidly globalising security environment. The course examines the evolution of security with a special focus on human security, the interlinkages between issues, and the value of adopting a more forward-looking approach in international security. The course deepens participants' understanding of contemporary security threats in order to prepare and empower them to have greater strategic impact in building a better security environment for the future.

COURSE FOCUS:

The first module maps the changing face of international security and evolving sources of insecurity, covering a wide range of themes, including migration, climate change, cybersecurity, emerging technologies, terrorism, and organised crime.

The second module tackles the implications of these challenges by addressing prevention, managing conflict and sustaining peace; security and law; and global and regional governance.

The course is highly interactive, using a range of teaching methodologies including expert presentations, participant-led sessions, and skills labs.

COURSE BENEFITS

- **Knowledge acquisition and transfer** – learn about current and future global security challenges, developing new perspectives on the evolution of security issues and their interlinkages across the threat spectrum. Share your knowledge and experience with other participants, the GCSP's global network of experts and GCSP educators.
- **Skills development** – conduct practical exercises in crisis management, foresight, leadership, and strategic communication, for example. The inclusion of perspectives from multiple sectors and cultures reinforces your ability to operate in a global environment.
- **Network building** – visit organisations based in Geneva and beyond (past visits have included CERN, ICRC, Interpol, IOM, UNHCR, UNOG, WHO, and WTO). Course participants have continuing access to each other, GCSP staff, external experts (academics and practitioners), and other alumni. This global community constitutes a permanent resource, enabling participants to share perspectives and maintain contact on critical topics in international security.
