This course explores the fundamentals of strategic foresight and how to create sustainable decisions in uncertain and rapidly changing contexts. It examines emerging security challenges, foresight methodologies, as well as when to apply specific tools and how to design purpose-driven processes.

COURSE BENEFITS

The three-day course will help participants develop a strategic foresight skill-set and learn how to apply such skills. They will also examine emerging security challenges and – applying a combination of theory and practice – learn about the potential implications.
