This course examines the security implications of emerging issues. It covers both technologies, such as artificial intelligence and distributed ledger technology, and global issues such as health security and terrorism.

Given the growing importance of anticipating emerging challenges, the course also covers the basics of strategic foresight.

COURSE BENEFITS

The course will provide a unique opportunity to gauge emerging security challenges as well as their interlinkages. As a participant, you will get to:

- understand the key concepts behind strategic foresight and how foresight methodologies can be used to identify emerging issues
- gain familiarity with several emerging technologies and their possible security implications
- recognise the principal challenges associated with a number of global issues in an increasingly interconnected world

COURSE FOCUS:

The first day will introduce emerging issues and the methodologies of strategic foresight utilised to discover those issues and their interconnections. The second day will cover emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence, additive manufacturing and distributed ledger technology, examining specifically the evolution and implications of these trends. The final day will bridge the gap between emerging technologies and global issues by addressing such issues as global health threats, climate change, and terrorism. Lastly, the course will address the governance of emerging issues.





Course Director

Emily Munro is Deputy Head of the Emerging Security Challenges Programme at the GCSP. Her work focuses on strategic anticipation and international security and on initiatives seeking to foster dialogue on emerging challenges. She is also a frequent contributor to GCSP executive education programmes. She has 15 years of experience in international security and holds degrees from the University of British Columbia and the Graduate Institute (Geneva).
